Celtic monks of the sixth century set sail from Ireland and Wales in small boats made of hides, reports Esther de Waal, to drift without oars until they found land. They wandered from Iceland to Italy seeking their true home, in perpetual travel, peregrinati, pilgrims, or as St. Columbanus called all Christians, "guests of the world."

"Pilgrims are persons in motion—passing through territories not their own," writes Richard Niebuhr, "seeking something we might call completion, or perhaps the word clarity will do as well, a goal to which only the spirit's compass points the way." Before the day of Pentecost, before that crowded moment in Jerusalem, the disciples were in hiding or had returned to their old lives. On Pentecost, they became the first pilgrims. With those flames riding their ears, they got into boats or walked out into the countryside to carry their words to the ends of the earth.

This is the craving of the Holy Spirit, the driving passionate voice. It is her hand set against my back, I see now. It is not finished, she whispers. It did not end with the one on the cross.

What Is Pentecost ?

The Sunday fifty days after Easter on which the church remembers the bestowal of the gift of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles. The name derives from the Greek name of the Jewish Festival of Weeks (an agricultural event that focused on the harvesting of the first fruits) fifty days after the Passover. Because this event signaled the beginning of the apostles public proclamation of Jesus as the Christ, it is often called the birthday of the Christian church. Because it is also a traditional day for Baptisms, and because people at one time uniformly wore white garments in which to be baptized, the day also became known as Whitsunday (White Sunday).
